Roger trained as a geographer and geomorphologist. He worked in the Scottish office specialising in economic development and the environment for 17 years, and was subsequently the founder Chief Executive of Scottish Natural Heritage.

Roger is Chairman of Plantlife International, a Board member of the National Trust for Scotland, the Scotlish Agricultural College, Fieldfare, Patron of the Scotlish Association of Geography Teachers, Honorary Professor at the University of Edinburgh and Visiting Professor at the University of Aberdeen.

He is actively involved in advising anyone who is prepared to listen on environmental strategy and action, especially in Iceland and Scotland.

Co-founder Gillian Khosla says: "Having started CCC with an ambitious programme of training and outreach work now is the right time to increase the skills within the Centre and extend Board membership beyond the original 3 founders. Roger's wisdom, experience and reach will be of great value to the whole team and we welcome him warmly"

Professor Roger Crofts states "I am delighted to be joining the Crichton Carbon Centre team. It is an exciting initiative that has achieved much in its first 2 years. The MSc in Carbon Management, which it runs with Glasgow University, has been a great success.
